As a leader in our industry, we recognize our responsibility to take decisive and impactful actions to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions across all our operations. This commitment not only aligns with the interests of our customers, society, and shareholders but also mitigates transition risks to ensure the long-term resilience and success of our business. Our strategy is informed by an understanding that climate-related risks, evolving regulatory landscapes, and market dynamics will continue to shape our operations in the years ahead.

This policy articulates Casadevall Group's approach and dedication to managing the climate-related impacts of our business activities. It provides guidance on how we integrate climate considerations throughout our supply chain.

Casadevall Group adheres to all relevant national laws and regulations pertaining to environmental protection and climate issues. This policy complements those legal obligations and serves as a unified reference to promote consistent awareness and action throughout the organization.

Scope

This policy applies to all employees, contractors, suppliers, and partners engaged in Casadevall Group's operations worldwide. It encompasses all activities that contribute to the company's greenhouse gas emissions, including material sourcing, production, logistics, and project delivery. All relevant parties are expected to integrate the principles of this policy into their work to support Casadevall Group's commitment to reducing its climate impact and achieving net-zero emissions. Sustainable sourcing

When assessing our climate-related impact, it is clear that a significant portion arises not only from our own operations but also from our broader value chain, including the sourcing of raw materials and services. Recognizing that raw material procurement is a major contributor to greenhouse gas emissions, we are actively exploring low-carbon alternatives.

We work closely with suppliers to identify and implement these material alternatives, promoting transparency and sustainability throughout the supply chain. Sustainable sourcing is embedded in our operational approach to ensure that every stage of crafting and fabrication reflects our commitment to climate responsibility.

Emissions related to transportation

We recognize that a significant portion of our climate-related impact arises from both upstream and downstream transportation activities across our supply chain. These transportation emissions contribute to our overall carbon footprint. To address this, we are committed to carefully selecting transportation suppliers who share our dedication to sustainability and can actively support us in reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

By striving to partner with carriers that prioritize low-emission logistics solutions, such as utilizing fuel-efficient vehicles, optimizing route planning, and investing in alternative fuels or electric transportation, we aim to minimize the emissions from transporting materials and finished products. Additionally, we will continuously evaluate our transportation strategies to identify opportunities for greater efficiency and emissions reduction throughout the entire logistics process.

Energy efficiency

Energy use represents a key component of Casadevall Group's environmental considerations. Therefore, incorporating energy efficiency measures and renewable energy usage in our operations is of key importance. Casadevall Group will prioritize the consumption of renewable energy through measures such as production of renewable energy, purchase of renewable energy certificates, or entering into power purchasing agreements.

Energy efficiency measures are embedded into Casadevall Group's operational processes with the objective of promoting effective energy management. These

efforts are part of an ongoing approach to integrate sustainable energy practices into everyday activities and fabrication operations.

Enhanced data collection

At Casadevall Group, we recognize the value of understanding the environmental impacts associated with our products and services throughout their life cycles. Assessments such as Life Cycle Assessments (LCAs), Product Carbon Footprints (PCF) or Environmental Product Declarations (EPD) provide a structured approach to evaluate these impacts from material sourcing to end-of-life disposal or reuse. Performing these assessments helps to make more sustainable decision-making in the selection of materials, design, and fabrication processes. We acknowledge the role of such assessments in identifying opportunities to reduce environmental impacts and improve resource efficiency within our production and services.
